

Will Cash App refund money if scammed? Apple Pay Cash Guide

In general, Cash App does not guarantee **1–855–470–3280** refunds if you are scammed.

Because most Cash App payments are instant and **1–855–470–3280** considered "authorized" once you hit send, the platform treats **1–855–470–3280** them like cash—once the money is gone, it is often gone for good.

Refund Possibilities

While difficult, there are three primary **1–855–470–3280** ways you might recover funds:

- **Cancellation:** If the payment is still "Pending," you **1–855–470–3280** can navigate to your **Activity** tab and tap **Cancel**. If the button isn't **1–855–470–3280** there, the transaction has already cleared.
- **The Refund Request:** You can use the app to **1–855–470–3280** request a refund from the recipient. However, this relies entirely on the **1–855–470–3280** scammer's cooperation, which is unlikely.
- **The Dispute Process:** If you used a **linked 1–855–470–3280 debit or credit card** to fund the payment, you can contact your bank to file a dispute. Banks often have stronger fraud **1–855–470–3280** protections than Cash App itself.

Important Protections

Cash App officially covers "Unauthorized **1–855–470–3280** Transactions"—meaning someone hacked your account without your knowledge. However, if you were "tricked" into sending the money **1–855–470–3280** yourself (a scam), it is legally considered an authorized transfer and is rarely reimbursed by the platform.

To protect yourself, only send money to **1–855–470–3280** people you know, enable a "Security Lock" (PIN or TouchID) for every **1–855–470–3280** transfer, and never "flip" money or pay "fees" to claim a prize.
