Editorial policy

Content guidelines for the “Public” webpage on the ISO 20022 site:

- Publically sourced (i.e., not official ISO 20022 content).
- Publically and freely available.
- Not commercial in nature.
- Involves no infringement of intellectual property right

The RMG Communications Group manages review and acceptance on content, and reserves the right to accept, reject and/or retire any submission for any reason at its sole discretion. The Communications Group will look to provide a representative portfolio of content.

Subject guidelines

Adds to the body of knowledge and resources related to ISO 20022. Desired subjects include:

- Technical, adoption, use cases, educational, tips and tricks, etc. across all financial services domains addressed by ISO 20022.
- Submission may be documents or URLs.
- Limited in sales content (no sales pitch).

Successful submissions should promote the goals of ISO 20022 and should address the interests and needs of our membership representing business process and standards across the financial services lifecycle (e.g., Securities, Payments, etc.).

Source guidelines

Any source is possible, [RMG Member Entities](#) are favored as are payment systems, market infrastructures, other public communities. All contributors meeting the stated requirements are welcomed.

Process

Submission: Submission is by email to the ISO 20022 RA at iso20022ra@iso20022.org. Please include the following in the email:

- The link or document and a short description of same
- Brief details on the submitter (employer, position, and relationship to the publisher of the document)
- Confirmation that no intellectual property infringement will result from the publication of the link or document on the iso20022.org site.

Acceptance: The document selection and publication process is administered by the RMG Communications Group. The Communications Group reserves the right to accept, reject and/or retire any submission for any reason at its sole discretion. Documentation may be “aged off” as similar, more timely content is made available.
